

Choir Tour Chaperone FAQ

1. What is the cost?

The cost is the same for chaperones and students.

2. Who do I room with?

Chaperones can choose their roommates if they wish. Otherwise, I will assign rooms by gender. I will usually put three chaperones per room so that each can have a bed to themselves. Married couples who chaperone will be assigned their own room.

3. How many students will I be responsible for?

Chaperones are usually responsible for six students or less, but may be asked to chaperone up to but not exceeding 10 students.

3. Will I be chaperoning my own student?

Students are given the opportunity to choose their roommates (six per room) and chaperones are assigned to students by room assignment and gender. I will need male as well as female chaperones.

Regarding busing, if we have two or more students in a room that have a parent or relative traveling as a chaperone only one will be officially designated as that room's chaperone. I do make it a point, however, to keep parents/relatives and students together on the same bus unless specifically requested otherwise by the parent. You will be able to spend as much time with your student as you wish.

4. What do I have to do exactly?

A. Submit to a background check

Performed at the District Office by appointment

Bring a photo ID

B. Keep students safe

Perform bus checks and hotel checks

Make sure they follow the rules

Check in at set times during daily activities

C. Keep students organized

Ensure that they are aware of the schedule

Make certain that they have all materials needed for that day

D. Monitor and Report

Watch for students who are struggling, left out, or pairing off

Report any problems or concern to Mr. Wilcock

Detach and Return to Mr. Wilcock
